TRAINING AT THE CHICHESTER WORKSHOP 2024

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WELCOME

The Chichester Workshop is a centre for liturgical art, currently located in South Harting, north of Chichester. It was co-founded in 2023 by artists Aidan Hart, Martin Earle and Jim Blackstone working in association with Chichester Cathedral. Alongside the Workshop's day-to-day work of undertaking commissions across a broad range of traditional media, we offer an education programme that includes both practical artistic training and theological engagement.

Our aim is to revive the place of traditional liturgical art in Christian worship.

TRAINING AT THE CHICHESTER WORKSHOP

We believe the best way to train liturgical artists is in the context of a thriving workshop. We offer practical training in a variety of media in this context. Training includes taught courses and short apprenticeships lasting from a week to several months. Resident artists Jim Blackstone and Martin Earle hosted six apprentices in 2023 in skills ranging from preparing gessoed grounds to painting in egg tempera and making mosaic.

WHO CAN APPLY?

If you have an interest in the techniques of traditional Christian iconography and want to broaden your practical experience, then these training opportunities are for you.

HOW IS TRAINING FUNDED?

Both longer-term and short-term apprenticeships are a mixture of one-toone tuition, practical studies and, where projects allow, paid work. There is currently funding available via a charitable trust to cover some costs of tuition and materials which we can discuss during the application process. Fees for the off site short courses this year are paid directly to institutions where they are being held.

Apprentices at the Chichester Workshop will be responsible for the cost of their accommodation and transport.

WHERE IS THE CHICHESTER WORKSHOP?

The workshop is currently in the village of South Harting in the South Downs National Park, UK. South Harting is a 10 mins drive from Petersfield which is around an hour from London Waterloo by train. By the end of 2025 our aim is to have constructed a new workshop within the Chichester Cathedral Quarter.

APPRENTICESHIP 10 to 20 weeks

We are looking for anyone who has an initial grounding in liturgical art and who wants to develop their skills in a Workshop setting. The minimum period for an apprenticeship is two and a half months, starting not before April 2024 and at any time after that.

The content of the apprenticeship is flexible according to what skills and experience the apprentice brings, and on what larger commissions may be on the go in the Workshop. Skills on offer for tuition include panel making, gesso, gilding, tempera painting, carving and mosaic which an apprentice may want to practice alongside commissions they may have. Tuition will be provided by resident artists Jim Blackstone and Martin Earle.

ARTIST'S RESIDENCY 2 to 4 weeks

If you are an established liturgical artist and would like to join us in a residency lasting for a period of between two and four weeks, we would love to hear from you. All relevant skills are welcome, whether in painting, encaustic, sculpture in wood and stone, embroidery, architectural design - or other.

This is offered as an opportunity mutually to share skills and experience in a unique setting. It is anticipated that the residency artist would be working on their own commissioned or other work while in the Chichester Workshop; and there could be teaching options. The timing of the residency is flexible.

There may be some funding to support the residency which we can discuss through the application process.

SHORT APPRENTICESHIP: MAKING, GESSOING AND GILDING AN ALTARPIECE PANEL 3 weeks Starting mid-January 2024

An opportunity for one apprentice which will run five days a week from 15th January to 5th February (though these dates can be flexible depending on your availability).

The short apprenticeship will be based around Martin's commission to create a 150 \times 60cm altarpiece depicting eight Cumbrian martyrs and Our Lady Star of the Sea. The apprenticeship will cover all the steps in constructing and preparing a large traditional timber panel for egg tempera including initial wood work, carving, gessoing and water-gilding. Around 35 hours of this apprenticeship will be paid work at £15/hr.

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SHORT APPRENTICESHIP: ICON PAINTING Up to 3 weeks April 2024

Working alongside Jim as he works within a series of 6 commissioned 60×40 cm icons. This short apprenticeship would especially suit someone with experience in painting wanting to explore liturgical art.

Skills covered include icon design and with egg tempera. The duration of this opportunity is up to 3 weeks, depending on the requirements and availability of the apprentice. After initial practice, the apprentice might design and paint a half figure in egg tempera on gesso (or more, according to experience).

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SHORT APPRENTICESHIP: ICON CARVING 2 weeks May 2024

Work alongside Martin as he carves and polychromes a relief in oak of the Archangel Raphael for St Anne's Cathedral in Leeds.

This is a short apprenticeship is suitable for someone with previous experience in either icon painting or basic wood carving and would take place in May. The exact date is flexible depending on when you are available.

Skill covered make include tool sharpening, carving a face in oak and polychromy and water-gilding.

The cost of tuition has been covered by a charitable trust.

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SHORT APPRENTICESHIP: MOSAIC 2 weeks

Work alongside Jim as he makes a commissioned c.600x400mm mosaic of the Virgin Mary and Christ child. Suitable for beginners who ideally have experience in other liturgical arts.

Skills covered include mosaic design, selection of materials, cutting tesserae and the 'Ravenna' or 'double direct' method. After initial practice, the apprentice will make a study of a face using given works as creative reference.

SHORT COURSE: BYZANTINE MOSAIC 5 days 12 -16 February 2024 and 29 July - 2 August 2024

These five-day workshops will be taught by Martin at the Prince's Foundation School of Traditional Arts in London and provide an introduction to all aspects of traditional mosaic. By making two small mosaics, students will learn the principles with which Byzantine mosaics were designed and the techniques employed to realise them.

Students will use traditional materials, including glass tesserae from Murano in Venice and hand tools that have been in use since Roman times.

SHORT COURSE: ICON PAINTING 5 days 20-24 May and 16-20 September

In 2024 Aidan will be running two five-day icon painting workshops at Walcot Hall in Lydbury North, Shropshire (<u>www.walcothall.com</u>). In the May workshop students will concentrate on the face by painting a head or a bust, and in September will paint a full figure with an emphasis on proportion and drapery. There will be a talk with slides at the beginning of each workshop. The theology of the icon is also taught throughout the week in the context of learning the technique.

The course caters both for the inexperienced and the more experienced, on a first-come-first serve basis.
